To enroll in Compass:

- 1.) You will need to complete the [Compass Questionnaire](#), if you haven't already done so in the past.
- 2.) You will also need to pay the one-time registration fee through [Omella](#). If you do not want to pay the credit card processing fee, there is a direct deposit option.

*We are using a new system for enrollments because it helps streamline the system on the back end.
- 3.) Commit to having at least 1 student enrolled in 3 of the 5 sessions during the school year. You do this by enrolling in at least three sessions at the time of enrollment this summer/fall. This policy helps our teachers to know if they will have enough enrollment, and for planning their lessons, and purchasing enough supplies for the class.
- 4.) Signup for 2 tasks in the [SignUp Genius](#).
- 5.) Once that is done, we will add you to the 23-24 Compass Band page, where the new Omella registration links will be posted.
- 6.) Please give us 24 hours to process your request and add you to the NEW Compass Band Page.

* New Compass Families will be added after the class enrollment links have been posted for 48 hours; allowing time for returning Compass and Summit families to enroll.

- 7.) If you have any questions, problems, or concerns, please feel free to text me through the website, Band, or on my personal phone at 903-752-5260. Please allow 24 hours for a response.

Enrollment:

Session 1 Class Descriptions

PE: Theresa Wood, Grades K-5

Cost: \$40

Get ready for fun with each session being packed full of age-appropriate games and activities to promote teamwork, self-control, good sportsmanship, following directions, positive peer interactions, and leadership skills. What is special about this class is it serves only Kindergarten to 5th Grades, which allows for students to engage in activities at just the right developmental level and provide opportunity for maximum growth. These high energy sessions will be full of movement and light stretching.

Focused ART: Drawing, Theresa Wood, Grades K-5

Cost: \$40

Ms. Wood will be teaching this focused art class. In the class she will introduce the basic concepts in drawing. Students will learn about line families, dot families, and circle families, they will learn the basic concepts of shaping and value.

Lego Challenges: Theresa Wood, Grades K-6

Cost: \$40Ms. Wood will encourage students to work together in groups as they work to solve different problems with lego builds. The class will also have a lego gallery walk each class, where students walk around the room looking at each other's creation and solution to the class's daily challenge. Students will be able to ask questions of the builder and the builder will have the opportunity to respond to those questions. This part of Lego challenge helps to encourage students to present and build presentation skills.

Wood Working, Anna Kerr, Grades K-5

Cost : \$50This course will guide students with creating projects they can take home and reuse over and over again. They will have the opportunity to create an item using pre-cut wood, following along with instructions on how to assemble, from start to finish. They will learn the basics of how to use a tape measure, hammer and nails, screw driver, drill, clamps and other tools. We will go over different terminology and explore how fractions and angles work in real life applications through building. The goal of this course is to foster creativity while encouraging students to follow instruction, enjoy the process of building and end up with something they will take home and use! Some of the planned projects include a shadow box style bank, a sit on scooter, stilts, and a birdhouse. Depending on class size, parents are encouraged to sit alongside and help their student the first week.

Attributes of God, Anna Kerr, Grades 3-8, Semester class, Session 1-3

Time:12:30pm-1:30pm

Cost: \$45 (for all 15 weeks)

A new 25 week curriculum that helps children understand the character and nature of God. With children, we dive into scripture, learning the amazing truths of who God is and how very different He is from us. If we want to raise children who remain firmly rooted in the faith, we must ensure that they know God as He truly is, not as they or others want Him to be or believe Him to be. Auto Maintenance. Mr. Skeeter Williamson, Grades 6-12

Cost: 40 \$

The automotive basic class is designed to provide high school students with a comprehensive understanding of fundamental Automotive Maintenance skills. In this class, students will gain hands-on experience and practical knowledge of various essential tasks, including oil changes, tire changes, spark plug replacement, wiper maintenance, and fluid checks. By the end of the course students will possess the necessary skills to perform these basic Automotive Maintenance procedures confidently and safely.

Omnikin Ball & more, Amy Johnson, Grades 5-12

Cost: 40 \$

Omnikin ball is the amazingly fun sport that you have probably never heard of. Kin Ball was invented in Canada in the 80's and claims to be the only cooperative sport in the world played with three teams. This competitive, interactive game is played around the world and a favorite of both young and older students! The goal is, for your team to not let the ball hit the floor when your team color is called out at the time of service. If your team color is called and your team doesn't keep the ball from touching the ground, then the other two teams receive a point. Kin Ball promotes physical activity, sportsmanship, and teamwork. There are a variety of other fun games that can also played with our 48 inch Omnikin Balls! During this session we may also play a variety of other PE skill

based games, and exercises to mix up the time. Like all games, the more you practice this sport the easier and better students will progress.

Tuesday Session 2 Class Descriptions

PE, Theresa Wood, Grades K-5

Cost: 40 \$

Get ready for fun with each session being packed full of age-appropriate games and activities to promote teamwork, self-control, good sportsmanship, following directions, positive peer interactions, and leadership skills. What is special about this class is it serves only Kindergarten to 5th Grades which allows for students to engage in activities at just the right developmental level and provide opportunity for maximum growth. These high energy sessions will be full of movement and light stretching.

The Rock Cycle, Anna Kerr, Grades K-5

Cost: 40 \$

In the Rock Cycle class we will be using a curriculum from “ The Classroom Nook” . Throughout the session students will learn to work in groups to do various activities like sorting rocks by different principles and characteristics. Students will learn the role of a geologist and why what they do is important. Students will look at the layers of the earth, and learn to identify the different parts of the earth as well as where rocks are found, where they are created, what a rock is and what a mineral is, and how they relate and differ. Students will then begin to address the 3 different types of rocks (metamorphic, igneous, and sedimentary), and how to identify them, they will also learn how to identify and test different minerals using Moh’s Hardness Scale. All of this and more!

Creation Science: Light, Theresa Wood, Grades K-5

Cost: 40 \$

Each session will explore a different aspect of the first day of creation-Light! Weekly students will explore the science behind light with 1-3 hands-on experiments. Concepts: Let there be light and colors in creation, absorbing and reflecting, light and energy,

energy conservation, and How the human eye sees and the light you do not see. Lessons taken from the curriculum series “Science in the Beginning” by Jaye Wile.

Dodge Ball Games & more: Theresa Wood, Grades 4-8

Cost: 40 \$

Students will have a blast in the class playing all the fun dodgeball based games they know and love. Not to mention other games, and activities too. Sometimes they will be on a team as they work together to get the opposing team out, and at other times they will face each other independently. This class will look at the concepts of light and perspective. We will address how light affects the perspective of an audience. We will also look at how light creates shadows and highlights various objects in a piece of art. We will both be creating art and looking at examples of this in famous pieces of artwork. We will also learn how to work with shadows and shading. The last thing we will discuss is how perspective changes from person to person and how an artist uses their individual perspective to create artwork that is unique to them and their style.

Small Engine Repair, Mr. Skeeter Willamson, Grades 6-12

Cost: 40 \$

Welcome to the small engine repair class! In this Hands-On class, students will gain practical skills in the repair and maintenance of a variety of small machines commonly found in homes and gardens. examples are things such as lawn mowers, chainsaws, weed eaters, and other small engine devices. Whether you have an interest in fixing things or want to learn how to maintain your own equipment, this class will provide you with the knowledge and confidence to tackle basic Small Engine repairs. Machines will be provided, but if you have any broken machines bring them.

Archery Tag and More, Amy Johnson, Grades 6-12

Cost: 40 \$

Archery Tag® is an exhilarating game for adults & children ages 7 and up combining combat-type, dodgeball games with foam-tipped archery arrows. Over the 5 week long session, kids will learn how to shoot a bow and arrow, strategize with their team how to eliminate their opponent, or reach the highest number of points during a timed game by catching, hitting and shooting out targets, or play other fun games archery games like protect the President, Infection, Doctor, obstacle courses and more. If the kids are up for a change of pace, a variety of other fun structured PE style games will be taught during the session as well. Great Artist Studio: America, Theresa Wood, Grades K-5

This course is geared towards the student who enjoys writing as a hobby. We will be focusing on poetic forms and prose specifically.

History of Weapons, Anna Kerr, Grades 4-12

Cost:40 \$

This exciting class will look at different ancient and medieval weapons of mass destruction from history. Each week the students will build a working model of these

historic weapons. They will also learn a lesson about how this weapon affected history and its effect in various battles throughout history. If your student loves things like catapults, darts, bows and arrows, trebuchets, or other weapons of mass destruction, then they will certainly love this class.

Floor Ball and More, Amy Johnson Grades 5-12

Cost:40 \$

The fast paced game of Floorball was invented in Sweden in the late 1960's. Floorball is a game similar to hockey that is played with shorter sticks than hockey sticks and balls that look similar to a wiffle ball. Two teams of 6 students attempt to score the most shots on goal. Students will learn how to dribble, pass, shoot, and the rules to play this exciting game. Like all games, the more you practice this sport the easier and better students will progress. So join this class to sharpen your Floorball skills though drills, scrimmages and more! During this session we may also play a variety of other PE skill based games, and exercises to mix up the time.
